Trip Report

**Country Visited: UGANDA** 

Dates of travel: 06/16 -07/16/2010

**Purpose of Trip: Data collection for Master's Thesis** 

The aim of the trip was to conduct a survey on the sanitary and phytosanitary measures used in the trade of agricultural products, specifically maize, rice, tomatoes and plantain. This survey is part of the Africa Food Security Initiative IPM CRSP project. This project is intended to identify trade bottlenecks in West Africa and East Africa. The survey targeted exporters and importers of major food staples in Uganda. Other stake holders in the trade arena were also interviewed such as the Ministry of Trade, Ministry of finance and Ministry of Agriculture and their respective operational bodies such as Uganda Export Promotions board and Uganda National Bureau of Standards which operate under the umbrella of Ministry of trade.

**Description of Activities/Observation:** 

The survey consisted of collecting baseline data from the exporters and importers that will be used to evaluate the impact of sanitary and phytosanitary measures in agricultural trade. Further analysis of this information will be done to determine the welfare impacts of these regulatory measures. In addition, secondary data was collected from national and international agencies working within the framework of agricultural trade. Some of this information will be used to describe the past, current situation, and future prospects the Uganda government in relation to sanitary and phytosanitary measures in agricultural trade. The major activities employed include:

**Activities:** 

1) Preparation for the field.

Making appointments:

Given the nature of the respondents for this study, prior arrangements for the meetings were a must. Google searches yielded a few contacts but most of the useful respondents were obtained

from the Uganda Export Promotions Board database. These were contacted through phone calls in order to fix appointments with them in advance. Other contacts were simply referred to by friends.

#### Tool testing:

The checklist was tested for its suitability to yield the expected responses from the respondents. A few changes were made in areas where questions seemed a bit ambiguous and confusing. Four people from different fields were used, the coordinator of Horticultural Export Association of Uganda (HORTEXA), the business consultant of TECHNOSERVE, scientist from Central International and Tropical Agriculture (CIAT) and one exporter.

## Change of Plan:

The responses obtained from the four stakeholders resulted in a plan modification. Because the initial plan had anticipated yielding all the necessary information from the exporting and importing companies, the pretesting stage revealed that some details could not be obtained this way. Therefore a new plan for approaching both Government and International agencies related to agriculture and trade was identified as necessary.

## 2) Survey implementation and sites visited

#### Locations and distribution of respondents:

Most of the exporting and importing companies surveyed are located in Kampala, Wakiso, Mpigi, and Busia districts. These four districts fall into two regions. Kampala, Wakiso, and Mpigi are in the central region while Busia is in the Eastern part of Uganda. This distribution was chosen to cover the three main means through which exporters and importers move their agricultural products into and out of Uganda. In this study, exports and imports move by land, air, and water. This variation was considered to check for consistency of the SPS measures for goods crossing the border in the three means. These three modes also define the nature of markets served. On the export side, most of the exports leaving Uganda by land are destined for neighboring countries (i.e. countries within the African region), while those leaving by air are normally destined for countries out of Africa such as in the European Union. As for water, it depends on the nature of the goods, but they are normally imports of very heavy loads. Like

imports of industrial and farm machinery, food wagons etc. The furthest area reached was Busia which is 175miles from Kampala and Luzira port bell which is 8miles from Kampala.

## Sampling:

Exporters were purposively selected from the existing list of exporters from UEPB. This was done because the study is very specific in terms of products dealt with. Also, exporters of agricultural commodities specifically maize, rice, tomatoes and plantain are not many. Some were reached by the use of anotherl method since some of the traders are operating as individuals and are not registered with the Uganda export promotions Board. The total number of companies and individual surveyed is given in table 1 below. Other sources visited are indicated in table 2 below.

### Data entry and cleaning

Out of the 328 export companies that are registered with the Uganda Export Promotions Board (UEPB 2009), 80 companies are dealing in agricultural exports and only 37 were surveyed. This was because some of the companies deal in other agricultural products other than maize, rice tomatoes and plantain. Other companies could not be easily accessed due to failure to communicate and locate them.

#### **Observations**

The results discussed below are general results based on the reactions obtained from the respondents.

A large share of agricultural products leaving Uganda to the surrounding countries of Kenya, Tanzania, Burundi, Rwanda, and DR Congo go through informal means. This means therefore that no sanitary and phytosanitary regulations are followed in this kind of trade. It all depends on the individuals involved to ensure food safety. All the companies targeting more formal markets, especially out of the African region, were found with structures that they use to fulfill some of the requirements. Also, different companies are faced with different requirements depending on the nature of the client or target market. Detailed data collected will be summarized and utilized in my thesis.
