	in Uganda (incited by Fusarium spp., Stenocarpella, Aspergillus; new interest in
	yellow maize for animal feeding industry, delivered data re: yellow mottle virus.
	Met plant pathologist (Julius Serumaga), food scientist (Archileo Kaaya) at dinner.
13 May	Met with Director of NACCRI, Julius Serumaga. Discussed new pathogens of
	maize and related cereal c rops (maize rough dwarf virus, Napier stunt incited by

	maize filed plots with Godfrey Asea. Discussed development of yellow maize
	varieties for animal feeding industry in Uganda with Godfrey Asea, NARO, and
