
- Feed the Future Food Security Innovation Center (FSIC) created in FY2012 identifies HICD as one of seven key programs

BIFAD CRSP Study Recommendation on HICD

Recommendation 6 – Foster and enhance the institutional capacity building dimension of CRSPs and other USAID projects

- Need for structured institutional assessments to diagnose weaknesses and set priorities for HICD
- Formulate long-term leadership development goals in specific countries (institutional context)
- Consider sectoral personnel training needs and institution goals in designing HICD initiatives



BIFAD CRSP HICD recommendations - cont

- Improve tracking of HICD impact over time to include analysis of networking opportunities, and trainees career trajectory follow-up
- Focus on building post-graduate training capacity in host country universities
- Explore distance learning for degree training, and other new models. Promote use of technologies for virtual network-building, distance learning curricula and e-Xtension to link researchers, trainees and other stakeholders.



BIFAD-Commissioned Study to Guide HICD Investments

- BIFAD study is in process Dr. Gebisa Ejeta BIFAD working group chair
- Study focus
 - Strengthening Access to US Higher Education Systems by Students from FtF countries
 - Collaboration between developing country and US universities and public/private sector institutions
 - Strengthening institutional capacity and partnerships to advance impact pathways
 - Build developing country access to US technology



Search for Best Practices in HICD

- Innovation Labs' outcomes and outputs in HICD can shed light on best practices in the context of a changing landscape.
- USAID innoVATE, BHEARD and MEAS programs all contain a best practices component.
- USAID HICD Policy with institutional focus useful to consider in future work, underscores BIFAD review.
- USAID Forward reforms focus on local capacity development, with new tools available to assess institutional capacity.
- Importance of multi-faceted approach to HICD, including institutional interface and soft skills training.



Opportunities for collaboration in HICD -BFS centrally-funded programs and Innovation Labs

- Coordinate on findings of BIFAD and APLU studies with discussion of recommendations
- Share knowledge of institutions, candidate pools, and other factors
- Consider together how best to coordinate and support human and institutional components of capacity development.
- Improved coordination with USAID mission partners
- Access to data and uniform M&E related to Innovation Lab HICD.
